19th Judicial District announces District Court vacancy *Commission sets date to select nominees*

The Nineteenth Judicial District Nominating Commission will meet Aug. 26, 2013, at the Weld County Courthouse (901 Ninth Avenue, Greeley, CO 80632) to interview and select nominees for appointment by the governor to the office of district judge for the Nineteenth Judicial District (Weld County). The vacancy will be created by the retirement of the Honorable Daniel Maus. The vacancy will occur on Oct. 11, 2013.

To be eligible for appointment to fill the vacancy, the applicant must be a qualified elector of the Nineteenth Judicial District and must have been admitted to the practice of law in Colorado for five years. The current annual salary for this position is \$133,228. The initial term of office of a district judge is a provisional term of two years; thereafter, the incumbent district judge, if approved by the voters, has a term of six years.

The original, signed application and an identical copy stored electronically as a PDF (please see instructions below for further details) must be filed with the ex officio chair no later than 4 p.m. Friday, Aug. 9, 2013. Late applications will not be considered. Any person wishing to suggest a candidate to fill the vacancy may do so by letter to be submitted to any member of the nominating commission, with a copy to the ex officio chair, no later than 4 p.m. Friday, July 26, 2013.

Instructions

1. The application form for a Colorado state court judgeship can be found on the Judicial Branch website at <http://www.courts.state.co.us/Careers/Judge.cfm>. You should only use the application that says it was updated 04/09. Do not use a prior version of the application. Please be complete and thorough in answering the questions; and, if an answer to any question requires more space than provided, attach a separate sheet of paper for each question.
2. Do not change the margins or font size on the application.
3. You must submit one original signed application along with an identical copy of your application electronically as a PDF file (preferably in text searchable format) on a CD or flash drive (these will not be returned). The electronic application does not need to contain a signature. If your application materials include multiple documents (i.e., cover letter, personal statement, reference letters) these documents should be combined into one single PDF document with the reference letters attached last.
4. You may submit letters of reference from up to **five** individuals who are in a position to comment upon your qualifications for a judicial position. You may include the reference letters with your application, or have them sent directly to us at the address below. If sent directly by the author, they need only send us one original letter (in paper). If you include them with your application materials, please submit the original paper letter and it should be part included as part of your electronic application as well. It is your responsibility to ensure that all letters of reference are submitted to the by the filing deadline.
