# **Request for Guardian or Conservator**

Someone has asked the court to assign you a guardian, conservator, or both.

# 1. Know the Terms



| Guardian    | This person will make decisions about your care, |
|-------------|--|
|             | education, and health.                           |
| Conservator | This person will manage your financial affairs.  |

These professionals will encourage you to join in decisions. They will work so you can regain the ability to make your own decisions.

#### 2. You can Disagree



- To a guardian or conservator being assigned.
- To the specific person wanting to be the guardian or conservator.
- To the powers, scope, and duration of the guardian or conservator.
- With having a hearing that is open to the public.

## 3. Your Lawyer



- You can choose and pay for your own lawyer. Or,
- If you can't afford a lawyer, you can request one from the court.

The court may decide to assign a lawyer regardless. This may be based on its own determination. Or, based on a *court visitor* recommendation.

#### You Have the Right to:

- A copy of the request that started the case. (Called a petition).
- Written notice of where and when the hearing will be.
- Request a private hearing. (Closed to the public.)
- A Hearing that reasonably accommodates you.
- Provide documents and call witnesses to testify at the hearing.
- Ask questions to witnesses.
- Have the court require someone to come to the hearing.
- Have the court require someone to provide you documents.
- Request an evaluation by a doctor before the hearing. The doctor must file a written report with the Court.

The Court may appoint a doctor or other professional. The doctor will evaluate your alleged impairment. Then, they will submit a written report.

#### 5. What You Must Do



- Attend the hearing, unless excused by the court.
- Pay the costs of the proceedings. This includes your attorney fees. The court may decide otherwise.
- If a guardian is appointed, follow the federal firearms prohibitions.
