Subject: The Mediation Process: Domestic Violence

## DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- An ODR Neutral shall conduct screening to assess for domestic violence and shall attempt to determine the nature and extent of any suspected or alleged domestic violence. A Neutral shall declare the mediation inappropriate if:
  - a. (a) the violence is ongoing;
  - b. (b) the Neutral has any concern that mediation may increase the level of violence between the parties;
  - c. (c) any party states that they are unwilling to participate due to the presence or history of physical or psychological abuse; or
  - d. (d) the Neutral believes mediation is otherwise inappropriate. See Section C.R.S. 13-22-311 (1)
- 2. If an ODR Neutral determines that mediation may proceed, the Neutral shall take appropriate precautions with respect to the safety and empowerment of the parties. Such measures may include:
  - a. conducting mediation sessions with each party on separate days or in separate rooms;
  - b. discussing with the parties whether other individuals (attorneys, friends, relatives, or other professionals) should accompany them to the mediation session.
- 3. Whenever possible, mediations involving allegations of domestic violence should take place at the courthouse.
