Bring your Subpoena to the court.	254	 Clerk will verify that the name of the Court, case number, date and time are accurate. The Clerk will then sign and date the form and return back to you for personal service on the witness.

Serve the Subpoena to the witnesses	254	 Service must be completed no later than 48 hours prior to the trial date. Personal Service must be done either by: The Sheriff's Department, Private Process Server, or by someone over the age of 18 who is not a party in this case, and who knows the rules of service. Provide both copies to the person or agency you chose to perform service on the witness. Attach the mileage check to the copy of the Subpoena to be served.
Return of Service	254	 Be sure to inform the person or agency performing service to return the completed copy of the Subpoena/Return of Service to you as soon as possible after service has been completed. Bring the completed Subpoena/Return of Service when you come to the trial.
