

<b>ORDER RE MOTION FOR ACCESS TO AND PRESERVATION OF CRIME SCENE (D-1)</b>	

This matter comes before the Court on Defendant's Motion for Access To And Preservation of Crime Scene (D-1). The Court has reviewed Defendant's Motion and has heard argument by the parties. Having been fully advised, the Court FINDS and ORDERS as follows:

At the hearing on July 23, 2012, Defense counsel advised the Court that Defendant's Motion for Access to And Preservation of Crime Scene (D-1) encompasses the residence of Defendant as well as the theater and surrounding areas.

In that the People and Defense have orally stipulated on the record at the advisement hearing that the People will give Defense at least 24 hours notice to have reasonable access to both crime scenes for inspection purposes, the Court FINDS Defendant's Motion MOOT and accepts and approves the parties' stipulation. The Court ORDERS cooperation between the parties in this matter.


