

Instructions to Access Dependency and Neglect Advisement OnLine

The Dependency and Neglect Advisement is available online or by DVD. The DVD and tools, were mailed to each Lead Dependency Judge in every Judicial District. The tools that accompany the advisement are; the written advisement, "Short List of Things" to do at each hearing, and Bench Card. The advisement is created in both English and Spanish. Captioning is available on the DVD only. The captioning is turned on by adjusting the DVD player setting.

The Dependency and Neglect Advisement (and tools) were developed to assist with caseload management prior to the Shelter, Temporary Protective Custody (TPC), Preliminary Protective Proceeding (PPP) hearing. Former respondent parents appear in the advisement to emphasize the importance of listening to the advisement, to explain the court process in a non-technical manner, and to reiterate the importance of active participation in a case.


On-Line Instructions:

1. Access the Colorado State Judicial Website @ www.courts.state.co.us.
2. Once on the courts webpage, click on the Self Help tab to view the drop down menu.
3. On the drop down menu, locate the Dependency and Neglect Advisement Tab at the bottom.
4. Click on the Dependency & Neglect Tab. This will advance to the D&N Advisement Web Page.
