| DECORUM ORDER | |

The Court is charged with ensuring the orderly disposition of this case, preserving the processes for conducting a fair trial, ensuring the security of those participating in and observing the trial, and providing a neutral and unbiased environment.

This Decorum Order will be in place for the entirety of the Court Proceedings regarding the public and media conduct. The Court may, at its discretion, amend this Order at any time. If the Order is amended, notice will be given to the public. The decorum and security of the courtroom will be at the discretion of the Court and law enforcement.

No member of the public or the media shall block any doorways or byways at any time. Press conferences may not be conducted inside the courthouse. Anyone in violation will be removed from the courthouse. Volume in the hallways must be kept down out of respect for other divisions that are in session.

Cell phones will not be permitted in the courtroom. The media will be permitted to use their laptops in the courtroom. Live tweeting and social media posts will be permitted during court proceedings through laptops only, no smart phone usage will be permitted. The Court will not be responsible for providing a power source nor the security of said laptops. Individuals will be responsible for providing their own Wi-Fi connection. While using laptops individuals must be respectful of court proceedings. Any loud noises, to include loud typing, will not be permitted. Individuals will be given one warning.

Seating will be first come, first serve. In times when the courtroom is close to capacity the Court (through staff) will only allow one media pool reporter, or more depending on available space, in the courtroom. It will be at the media's discretion to decide who the pool

reporter will be. Once court has started media is urged to remain in the courtroom during proceedings until a scheduled break. It will be strongly discouraged for individuals to be exiting and returning to the courtroom constantly throughout the trial. Please be respectful of the court proceedings and jurors.

The Court will allow one pool sketch artist during the court proceedings. The sketch artist must remain stationary during court proceedings. The sketch artist may reposition themselves during scheduled breaks only.

The Court will allow one pool camera in the courtroom at all times except during jury selection. At no time during court proceedings will the Court allow any other audio or video recording devices. The pool camera can either be motion or still but not both. If a still camera is used in the courtroom there must be a silencer and a flash may not be used. The camera and cameraman must remain stationary throughout court proceedings. The cameraman may reposition the camera during scheduled breaks only. It will be at the media's discretion to decide who will man the pool camera. The Court will allow live feed for the verdict only.


At no point during the court proceedings may the identity of the jurors, potential or otherwise, be released to the public. The pool camera will not be permitted to face jurors, potential or otherwise, during the jury trial. It is the individual choice of each juror whether they would like to speak with the media when the trial is concluded.

The verdict and/or Juror questions will be announced by the Court through the Twitter account of either Rob McCallum or Jon Sarche. Jury deliberation the courtroom will be closed and will only open when there is a verdict or jury question.

The Court can reconsider any part of this order throughout the court proceedings. This order will pertain to the jury trial scheduled for January 23, 2018 only. The media must submit an expanded media request form for any further court proceedings after said trial.
