6th Judicial District offers parenting time allocation clinic *Free seminar set for Friday*

DURANGO, Colo. – Through its Self-Help Center, the 6th Judicial District (Archuleta, La Plata and San Juan counties) is offering a seminar Friday, July 19, 2013, on the allocation of parental responsibilities, formerly known as “custody.”

The seminar, scheduled for 2:30-4:30 p.m. in the Anasazi Room of the courthouse at 1060 E. Second Avenue in Durango, is designed for unmarried parents or civil partners who need to set up formal decision-making and parenting time guidelines.

The 6th Judicial District’s Self-Help Center opened early this year to offer help to people representing themselves in non-criminal court proceedings. So far, the Colorado Judicial Branch has established such centers in 11 of the state’s 22 judicial districts, where case managers can provide procedural information, locate forms and help self-represented litigants complete them, and help them understand their options to try to resolve disputes outside the courtroom.
