Weld County Combined Courts introduce Court Information Center

GREELEY, Colo. – The Weld County Combined Courts announced today the opening of a new, free resource to help self-represented litigants in non-criminal court proceedings navigate the court system.

The Court Information Center can help self-represented litigants locate and complete court forms, review documents for completeness and can answer general and case-specific procedural questions. The Center also provides computer access for research and drafting purposes as well as online parenting classes.

“A significant percentage of cases in our courts involve self-represented litigants, most notably in domestic relations matters,” said 19th Judicial District Chief Judge James F. Hartmann Jr. “The resources offered through the Court Information Center will assist these individuals as well as offering other services to our community.”

The Court Information Center is part of a broader program the Colorado Judicial Branch created to help the public and the courts address the ever-increasing number of cases in which parties are not represented by attorneys.

The Center will also provide a “how-to” educational program featuring a new topic on the third Thursday of each month. The first class, scheduled for 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 15, will cover issues related to modifying child support orders.

The Center is open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and Thursdays by appointment. It is located on the first floor of the Centennial Building at 915 10th Street in Greeley.
