Employers now can check employees' jury service online *New online system replaces paper forms*

DENVER – A new online system available through the Colorado Judicial Department Web site will help employers easily see their employees' jury-service appearance dates.

The Electronic Jury Service Certificates, available at <http://www.courts.state.co.us/Jury/JurorCert.cfm>, replaces the previous paper forms. To obtain information about employees' jury service, employers can enter the employee's juror number, last name, location of the court where the employee appeared, and the date the employee reported to the court.

“The Electronic Jury Service Certificate is meant to provide employers with an easier, quicker way of verifying their employees' jury service,” said Colorado Supreme Court Justice Michael L. Bender, who heads the court's Jury System Standing Committee. “Our hope is that streamlining this process will make jury service a bit easier for both employees and employers.”

Jury commissioners still will be able to provide paper jury service certificates if necessary.
