Colorado Judicial Branch opens application period for Judicial Nominating Commission attorney positions *Four attorneys to be appointed by Dec. 31*

DENVER – The Colorado Judicial Branch is seeking attorney applicants for vacancies on judicial nominating commissions. Judicial nominating commissioners are volunteers and serve six-year terms. These attorney appointments are made jointly by the Governor, the Attorney General, and the Chief Justice.

The Supreme Court Nominating Commission will have two attorney vacancies as of Dec. 31. Applicants must be licensed attorneys who reside in the 2nd or 3rd congressional districts and may belong to any political party or be unaffiliated. The Supreme Court Nominating Commission selects nominees for judicial vacancies on the Colorado Supreme Court and Colorado Court of Appeals.

The Eleventh Judicial District Nominating Commission, which selects nominees for judicial vacancies in that district only, has one current attorney vacancy and will have another when a commissioner's term ends Dec. 31. Applicants must be licensed attorneys who reside in the Eleventh Judicial District and may belong to any political party or be unaffiliated. The commission is in particular need of applicants who reside in Custer County.
