

SIXTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT OVERVIEW

January 2017

The Sixth Judicial District encompasses La Plata, Archuleta and San Juan Counties. The county seats for the three named counties are Durango, Pagosa Springs and Silverton.

The population in the Sixth Judicial District is growing. La Plata County now has a population in excess of 50,000. The population in Archuleta and San Juan Counties are significantly smaller at 12,000 and 600. According to the Colorado Judicial Branch Statistical Report for July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016, the totals for the Sixth Judicial District are:

District Court filings increased by 3.7% and County Court filings increased 11% over the 2015 filings.

There are four district court judges, three county court judges, and two part-time magistrates that handle the case workload.

The four district court judges handle a mixed caseload of domestic relations, felony criminal matters, juvenile delinquent cases, water cases, all types of civil cases, probate, adoption and relinquishment cases, mental health and alcohol abuse commitments and dependency and neglect cases.

The county court judges handle traffic and misdemeanor cases, felony preliminary hearings, domestic abuse restraining orders and civil matters within their jurisdiction. The county judges in Archuleta and San Juan Counties are part-time.

The magistrates handle DV fast track, protection orders and miscellaneous court county and district court cases.

The Sixth Judicial District operates a domestic violence court, a behavioral health court, adult drug court and a DUI court.

In addition to the judges and magistrates, there are approximately 60 support staff positions. These positions include clerks of court, jury commissioner, court reporters, administrative specialists, Spanish interpreter, family court facilitator, court judicial assistants, legal research attorneys, collections staff, and probation department employees.

The present District Judges are Jeffrey R. Wilson, Chief Judge, Suzanne F. Carlson, William L. Herringer and Todd Norvell. The County Judges are Martha T. Minot (La Plata), Justin Fay (Archuleta) and Anthony D. Edwards (San Juan). The District Court Magistrates are Sarah F. Law and James A. Casey.
