Key: *Successful Terminations*: This number is exclusively state successful terminations.

*Unsuccessful Terminations*: This column includes those probationers who were revoked or absconded. A revocation is defined as a termination from probation supervision for a technical violation, new misdemeanor, or new felony. A revocation to Community Corrections is NOT included in this section. These offenders are not included on this table as they are still under the supervision and jurisdiction of probation. Absconded refers to probationers who became fugitives and are no longer compliant with probation supervision.

*Total Terminations*: In this table only, the total terminations include: revocations, absconders and successful terminations from probation supervision. Additional types of probation closures are included in Table 48.
