As the 21st Judicial District develops work processes to address COVID-19 in Mesa County we want to maintain timely communication with our local stakeholders and community members. Our current Court Operations Order outlines how we are conducting business with procedures in place to minimize the risk of COVID-19 to the community and our staff. The courts are open for limited business and court proceedings as outlined in the order. There are business procedures still in progress and more information will be forthcoming.

For any Court customer service needs please call 970-257-3640 and our court staff will work with you to determine if you can complete the business over the phone or online.

For any Probation customer service needs please call 970-257-3600 and our probation staff will work with you to determine if you can complete the business over the phone or online.

For those visiting the Justice Center in person we have changed operations to reflect the CDC's recommendations on public gatherings and proximity.

Starting on March 19, 2020, the courts and probation department are open during normal business hours (8:00 a.m. to 5:00 pm., excepting weekends and legal holidays). The Clerk's office will close at 4:30 for payments and other business.

For those attending court proceedings on cases not set over by the District Order, you may come to the justice center and attend the proceedings in person.

For those conducting business in person with our Clerk's office (making a payment, requesting paperwork, filing documents, etc.) **please call the customer service line first to see if you can handle the business off-site first at 970-257-3640.** If you appear in person you will need to call the same number (970-257-3640) in the courthouse and remain in the entrance area until our staff meet you to provide service.
