You are not required to meet with an attorney prior to purchasing forms or packets.

Volunteer attorneys will not provide a second opinion on your case if you already have an attorney. Volunteer attorneys do not represent you on your case. This service is designed for one conference. Please read the following information regarding the Civil “Ask an Attorney” Clinics:

To submit your waiver, you may email it to 01selfhelp@judicial.state.co.us or drop it off in-person with Court Resource Center Staff. Waivers must be submitted between 7:30 am the day prior to the scheduled clinic and 9:00 am the day of the clinic. Waivers will not be accepted outside of these times.

Due to limited time, the number of attendees allowed to sign up is also limited. Sign-up is on a first-come, first-served basis, and attendees will meet with the attorney in the order they sign up. You will be considered signed up once you submit the completed waiver to the Court Resource Center staff.

After you submit your waiver, you will be provided a 30-minute time window for the attorney to call you at the phone number provided on your waiver when it is your turn.

Please be available and paying attention to your phone during the time window you are given, and in an area where you have good cellphone reception (poor reception/dropped calls may impact your 15 minutes with the attorney). If you do not answer when the attorney calls, you may lose your opportunity to speak with the attorney.

During the clinic you will be allowed up to 15 minutes to discuss your legal matter with the volunteer attorney (this will be strictly monitored, so please organize and have your questions prepared ahead of time to make the best use of your time).
