Notice to Governmental Officials of Invocation of
Constitutional Rights

DIVISION 10

I understand that I am currently suspected or accused of committing a crime. I am unambiguously and unequivocally asserting my right to an attorney. I want no contact with the police or other law enforcement officials for the purpose of questioning me or investigating me for any type of criminal activity. I understand that it may be necessary to have medical or mental health staff contact me to ensure my safety and health. I also understand that it may be necessary to be contacted by an inmate classification officer. If contact does become necessary, I do not wish to be questioned concerning any suspected criminal activity.

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
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DIVISION 10

I am asserting my right against self-incrimination and my right to silence. I wish to speak only to my attorney. I am invoking all of my rights under *Miranda v. Arizona*, 384 U.S. 436 (1966). I will not waive my constitutional rights. I request that governmental officials not even request my consent except through my attorney.

This invocation of rights includes denial of access to my medical and mental health records kept by jail personnel without permission from my attorney.

I now revoke any and all previous waivers of my rights under *Miranda v. Arizona*, 384 U.S. 436 (1966).
