- 1. This matter comes before the Court following a hearing on December 9, 2021.
- 2. Stauch refused to appear for the hearing citing some issue with respect to her medications at the jail. A virtual link was established at the last minute to at least allow Stauch to appear virtually. In the future, if Stauch desires not to appear in person for a hearing, she must file a motion requesting to waive her appearance NO LATER THAN SEVEN (7) DAYS PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULED HEARING. Failure to file such a motion or refusal to attend a scheduled hearing may result in the Court issuing an Order authorizing the El Paso County Sheriff's Office to use all reasonable force necessary to secure the presence of Stauch at the hearing. Even if a motion is filed, Stauch must appear in person unless an Order granting the motion has been entered.
- 3. Stauch has raised the issue of a as a mental condition defense for some of the charges in this case. Stauch was advised of the need for an evaluation by physicians or psychologists on the issue. The Court ORDERS the evaluation to take place at CMHIP. The evaluators shall be provided with Stauch's competency evaluations that were previously performed in this case. Any interview of Stauch must be audio and video recorded in compliance with the requirements of C.R.S. §16-8-106(1)(b).
- 4. If Stauch chooses to pursue a mental condition defense, Stauch must endorse the expert through whom such testimony is to be offered and provide a written summary of the testimony expected from such expert describing the witness's opinions and the bases and reasons therefor, including any underlying facts or data for the opinion, the results of any physical or mental examinations and of scientific tests, experiments or comparisons in conformity with Rule 16(Part II)(b) of the Colorado Rules of Criminal Procedure no later than 63 days prior to trial.
- 5. This matter is set for a hearing on motions to occur on January 13, 2022. All motions are to be filed no later than December 30, 2021. If Stauch has been transported to CMHIP

prior to January 13, 2022 and is not expected to have returned by that date, the motions hearing date will be postponed.
