COURTROOM DECORUM ORDER DURING TRIAL (C-41)	

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Due to the heightened public interest in this case, the Court wishes to ensure that the trial of this case and all court proceedings held in the La Plata County Courthouse (hereinafter the "LPCC") are conducted in an orderly and dignified manner without any undue disruption. The Court is therefore entering this Court Decorum Order to avoid unnecessary disruptions to the various courtrooms and offices located in the LPCC.

Throughout all proceedings in this case, the Court orders:

1. With the exceptions listed below, no persons shall enter a courtroom (including any overflow room that is being provided with a live audio and video feed of any court proceedings) wherein any proceedings in this case are being conducted with any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, computers, cameras, cell phones, video phones, tape recorders, iPads, or other recording or transmitting devices. This provision shall not apply to employees of the court or the La Plata County Sheriff's Office or to other law enforcement personnel in the LPCC for law enforcement purposes. Nothing in this Order shall prohibit prosecution attorneys or defense counsel and their respective staffs from having these devices, to the extent necessary, to further the prosecution or defense of the case. If requested, the Court shall consider the granting of expanded media coverage for the trial which is scheduled to begin on April 2, 2020. Any requests for expanded media coverage for that they may have. If the motion for expanded media coverage is granted, the Court will allow live streaming of the proceedings via one TVU Pack starting with opening

statements. The live stream shall be pooled with all interested media. There shall be no expanded media coverage of jury selection. While tweeting, blogging, posting, etc., will not be allowed from the courtroom, there will be no such restriction on individuals watching the live stream.

- 2. The parties shall inform the Court as to how many support personnel and family members they expect to attend the trial and sit in the gallery. The Court will reserve seating in the Division 4 courtroom for such individuals during the trial, as well as reserve one row on one side of the courtroom for the media. The remainder of the gallery will be open for public seating. The Court informs the parties and media that during various times of initial jury selection on April 2 and 3, the entire gallery will be reserved for potential jurors and there will be limited standing room only.
- 3. No interviews shall be conducted within the courthouse. This provision does not restrict any member of the public or press from making inquiries of court personnel regarding the scheduling of proceedings, the filing of papers with the court, or requesting any other information in the public record concerning this case. No member of the public or media shall conduct or attempt to conduct any interview of any party (including the defendant), designated witnesses, or attorneys engaged in the case within the courthouse. Persons known or identified to be summoned or selected jurors shall not be approached, contacted, questioned, interviewed, or harassed, whether on or off the premises of the LPCC, about their prospective service, qualifications, opinions, or any other matter concerning this case until such time as the summoned or selected jurors have been discharged from jury service.
- 4. The media and members of the public may capture images of persons as they come and go from the courthouse, except those persons known or identified to be summoned or selected jurors may not have their images captured. Selected jurors will be given a juror badge, and any such person displaying the badge shall not have his or her image captured. Any summoned juror who displays a jury summons upon entrance to the courthouse shall not have his or her image captured. If an image of a person is captured before that person is determined to be a summoned or selected juror, his or her image shall not be displayed, distributed, or identified as a juror.
- 5. At all times there shall be clear passage and entry into the courthouse for all persons who conduct business with the court. There shall be no obstructions to the clear passage through the public hallways in the LPCC. At all times there shall be clear passage and entry for sheriffs and other emergency vehicles through the parking lots, entrances, and roadways leading to and from the LPCC. There shall be no attempts by any member of the public to contact any juror concerning this case or congregate or linger at any place any juror(s) are likely to be found.
- 6. No structures or other facilities, whether placed for a single proceeding or intended to remain in place until the conclusion of this matter, shall be erected, and no tents, chairs, tables, and similar items shall be placed on the public grounds of the LPCC or the parking lot or any property belonging to La Plata County except as approved and permitted by the

La Plata County Sheriff's Office and Court Executive, or, if appropriate, the La Plata County manager. Any such permitted structure or facilities which are intended for use as listening or viewing structures or facilities must meet the requirements imposed by the Court as to the transmission of any video or audio feed. Any conduct not otherwise approved, and which may damage or destroy existing lawn, pavement, or landscaping, is prohibited.

- 7. All members of the public and media must remain quiet and may not comment on the proceedings or engage in any disruptive behavior in the courtroom. No person shall wear or bring anything into the courthouse that expresses support for either the prosecution or defense. Included in this prohibition are any signs, photographs, T-shirts, or buttons that reference the case, the defendant, or the alleged victim in any way.
- 8. Any violation of the foregoing, and any other conduct which the Court finds disruptive to the proceedings, may result in an order of temporary or permanent exclusion from the proceedings and/or other legal sanctions, including contempt of court.
