



Order Concerning the Peoples Motion for Compliance With Courts Order (P-32)	

In the Court's order after Status Conference on July 25, 2019 (C-34), the Court ordered that the parties provide the Court with a rough estimate as to how many exhibits they expect to introduce at trial so that the Court could assign a range of exhibit numbers for the parties to use. The Court explained how exhibits were to be marked and ordered that on or before the pretrial conference that the parties provide the Court an exhibit list in Word and the format that the described exhibit list should follow. The Court also ordered that the defense file its proposed jury questionnaire within 14 days.

As of this date, neither side has provided the Court with a rough estimate of the number of exhibits they intend to use at trial and the defense has not provided the Court a proposed jury questionnaire. The Court therefore orders that prosecution exhibits shall be numbered 1-999. Any defense exhibits shall be numbered starting at 1,001. The order to prepare an exhibit list in the format previously ordered remains in effect as to the prosecution. To remain compliant with *People v. Kilgore* 455 P.3d 746 (Colo. 2020), the Court will not require the defense to prepare an exhibit list. **However, as to both parties, all exhibits that are referred to or tendered for admission during the trial shall be pre-marked with exhibit stickers that contain the date of the start of the trial (3/2/20), the case number and the exhibit number.** While the Court understands that during the course of trial the parties may need to refer to or admit unanticipated exhibits, the Court expects compliance with this order on exhibits that the parties reasonably know will be used at trial.

The Court will issue a proposed jury questionnaire prior to the PTC. The parties may propose any amendments to that questionnaire at that time.
