<b>ORDER REGARDING THE PEOPLE’S MOTION FOR SCENE VIEW</b> <b>P-3</b>	


After considering the arguments of counsel, the Court grants the motion for a view of the various scenes that the prosecution wishes the jury to view with the following conditions:

1. There will be no record able to be made during the various scene views. The prosecution and defense shall agree upon a system to mark and identify any areas of interest to the jury. The prosecution and defense shall agree upon a written explanation of the areas of interest that shall be made a court exhibit and shall be provided to the jury prior to traveling to the scene.
2. The prosecution shall arrange and pay for transportation for the jury to the various scenes with room in the bus/van(s) so that a bailiff will be in each vehicle used for the transportation of the jury.
3. The method of transportation shall not be by any vehicle or driver employed by law enforcement. The prosecution may provide water and any snacks appropriate for the jury as long as there is no indication that the same is being provided by the prosecution or the sheriff’s office.
4. The only persons allowed to attend the scene view shall be the jury, bailiff(s), attorneys, defendant, sheriff’s office security, and court personnel. If any media wish to accompany the scene view, the Court shall consider a request to allow a pool reporter, a pool still photographer and/or a pool video photographer.

5. When the jury is outside of their bus or van(s) viewing the various scenes, the only parties allowed to communicate with the jury shall be the Court, the bailiff(s), or other court personnel at the scene.
6. The details of the jury view, including the timing, shall be discussed at the pretrial conference in this case. Any requests by the media to attend the scene view shall be filed at least seven days prior to the pretrial conference so that the Court may discuss the request with counsel before the Court rules upon the request and the rules the media must follow if the request is granted.
