
Re-creation of the Record for the 12:30 PM Hearing Held on November 5, 2020 (C-58)

Due to the Court exhibiting mild COVID-19 symptoms the morning of November 5, 2020, the Court suspended this trial until Monday, November 9, 2020. The Court held two hearings on this case on November 5, 2020, at which the Court participated remotely. The Court has been informed by the court reporter that a good record was made at the morning hearing, but that much of what the Court stated at the 12:30 PM hearing on November 5, 2020, was not discernible. The Court will therefore issue this order to re-create the record.

At the 12:30 PM hearing, the Court again informed the parties that upon waking the morning of November 5, 2020, the undersigned judge noticed that while he could smell and taste most things, there were other things that he could not. After contacting San Juan Basin Health, the Court suspended the trial until appropriate testing could be completed. The undersigned judge also informed the parties that as of the time of the hearing, he had completely regained his sense of smell and taste. The Court informed the parties that it had already taken a nasal swab test for COVID-19 and would receive the results on Saturday, November 7, 2020. The Court further informed the parties that it would take a COVID-19 blood test after the hearing and would receive test results immediately. The Court told the parties that if both tests were negative, the trial in this case would resume on Monday, November 9, 2020, but if either test was positive, the Court would declare a mistrial. The Court asked the parties if they objected to this procedure. The prosecution did not object. The defense, without waiving any prior objections and motions it had previously raised requesting a mistrial due to a public health emergency, stated that it would be ready to resume the trial if both of the tests taken by the Court produced negative results.

If either side wishes to supplement this re-creation, they may file an appropriate motion.
