

Welcome to Division FAC

If you are scheduled for court, we still plan on hearing your case on this date and time! Just in a bit of a different way.

Currently the court is NOT holding any in-person hearings. Please don't come to court.

You are being sent a Rule 5 – First appearance advisement and instructions on how to “show up virtually” for your court date.

You WILL need to appear for your court date “virtually” through WebEx on your computer or tablet, or a WebEx app on your smart phone with a camera and microphone for audiovisual participation.

Except for the official court record, recording of any portion of a remote proceeding is strictly prohibited absent a court order granting permission. Any violation of this provision may result in the imposition of sanctions, including contempt of court.

You should use the following link to check-in with the clerk:

- Enter your name and email address (so we know who you are). You will then be in the Division FAC Check-in lobby.
- Select your audio setting. If the audio on your computer or tablet does not work, please use the alternate audio option of calling in to the number below.

Once you are checked in, we will verify your contact information and give you the next set of steps to be linked in with the District Attorney so that they can talk to you about your case and make you an offer.

Please be patient as we accommodate all the cases that need to be heard. Thank you and we look forward to having you join us virtually on your scheduled court date.
