WHEREAS,

day of *June* 1871, in the County of said ~~Franklin~~ *Weld*

the said A. L. Meeker did wilfully and maliciously damage and interfere with a certain gate to a flume of ditch commonly called ditch No 2, the property of the Union Colony of Colorado by wilfully and maliciously breaking the fastening of said gate to the said flume, and opening the same and permitting the water to run out, and damaging said flume to the amount of one hundred dollars

We Therefore Command You forthwith to take the said

and bring him forthwith before the said

H. L. Childs

Esquire, or, in case of his absence,

before any other Justice of the Peace, to be dealt with according to law. Hereof fail not at your peril.

and jointly and severally acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted unto the people of the Territory of Colo-
rado in the sum of five hundred dollars, to be levied
of their goods and chattels, lands and tenements, if default be made in the premises and conditions following, to-wit:

1871, was examined by and before J. L. Childs a Justice of the Peace in, and

for the county aforesaid, on a charge preferred against him for Wilfully and maliciously

and upon hearing the testimony of all the witnesses present, (they having been duly sworn) was adjudged and required

Babcock for the defence it is considered by me upon consideration of the facts and circumstances that the said C. W. Matteson be held under bonds for his appearance at the District Court of the first judicial district of Colorado to be holden in Evans Weld County on the 2nd Tuesday of December in the sum of 500, five hundred Dollars

 Ditch :
 J. R. Miner and H. C. Longan of the

County of Weld and State of Colorado, in conformity to the statutes in such case made and provided, make the following statement relating to the ditch known as the "The Miner & Longan Ditch" in the said county of Weld, and present the same for record.

The headgate of the said Miner & Longan Ditch is located on the South bank of the Little Thompson creek, one thousand feet north, sixty two degrees west of the south east corner of the North east quarter of Section twenty two, in township four north of range sixty eight west of the 6th P.M. in Weld county Colorado, running thence in an easterly direction through the land of S. B. French nine hundred and ninety feet to a point on the west line of the north west quarter of section twenty three, five hundred and nine feet north of the south west corner of said quarter section; thence in an easterly and north easterly direction on a curved line through the land of White and Butler four thousand one hundred and ten feet to a point on the North line of said section twenty three, six hundred and fifty eight feet east of the north west corner of the north east quarter of said section twenty three, thence north easterly through the land of W. J. Barker six hundred feet thence easterly and south easterly on a curved line one thousand five hundred feet to a point on the north line of the public highway, separating section twenty-three and fourteen, three hundred and forty nine feet west of the south west corner of the south ^{west} quarter of section thirteen; thence east three hundred and forty nine feet to said corner; thence easterly along the south line of said quarter section, through the land of Nort L. Evans one thousand nine hundred and fifty feet; thence north easterly nine hundred feet to the east line, to a point six hundred feet north of the south east corner of said ^{quarter} section; thence

north along the west line of said ^{quarter} section three hundred feet to place of ending.

The depth of said described ditch is two feet; the width on the bottom thereof is eight feet, with a slope of one to one, and a fall of four feet to the mile.

The carrying capacity of said ditch is forty and eight hundredths cubic feet per second of time.

The time of commencement of the work on said ditch was the 23d day of August A. D. 1893
