

LIVESTREAMING IN PROGRESS

Pursuant to C.R.S. § 13-1-132, livestreaming is required for all criminal proceedings and may occur for all other court proceedings. Livestreaming should be assumed at any/all times. Any conversation near an unmuted microphone is very likely to be heard over WebEx and the Livestreaming Platform. If you have questions as to the location of microphones and/or how to mute the microphones, please ask court staff or the judge for direction.

The cameras are generally pointed toward the gallery/parties/podium and the judge. All efforts will be made to keep cameras from pointing at jurors during any stage of a jury trial.

Witnesses who may be called to testify, shall not access the proceeding by WebEx or Livestreaming until notified to join the proceeding. Parties must advise any possible witnesses that WebEx or Livestreaming is prohibited until they are called to testify.

If you believe the hearing you are engaged in, involves sensitive or otherwise confidential information, please inform the judge (on the record) and the judge will decide whether livestreaming will be turned off for the proceeding.
