Gov. Hickenlooper announces appointments to the 2nd Judicial District

DENVER – Thursday, April 14, 2016 – Gov. John Hickenlooper announced today his appointments of Jay Grant and Jennifer Torrington to serve as district court judges in the 2nd Judicial District (Denver). Grant and Torrington will fill vacancies created by the retirement of the Honorable R. Michael Mullins and the resignation of the Honorable Ann B. Frick.

Grant is currently a lead attorney with the Colorado Public Defenders Office in Denver. From 2003-2004, he was an associate with Stiner, Beck, Jonson and Nolan where he practiced family and criminal law. Grant received his undergraduate degree from New Mexico State University in 1989, his M.A. in History from New Mexico State University in 1992, and his Juris Doctor from Oklahoma City University in 1997.

Torrington is currently a magistrate judge in the Denver District Court, where she works on post-decree domestic cases. Prior to assuming this role, she was a magistrate judge in the Denver Juvenile Court from 2004-2015. Torrington received her undergraduate degree from the University of Arizona in 1993 and her Juris Doctor from the University of Colorado in 1999. The appointments are effective July 1, 2016.
